East West Players, the nation's first and foremost Asian Pacific American theatre, presents the most daring and bold event in its 30 year history: WHITELANDS by Chay Yew.

WHITELANDS will be presented in three parts:
Part I - PORCELAIN, Part II - A LANGUAGE OF THEIR OWN and Part III - HALF LIVES. The three parts will be presented on Saturdays and Sundays in a 7-1/2 hour MARATHON performance beginning at 2 OOpm, which includes a two-hour dinner break after Part II. The plays may also be seen separately on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays at 8 OOpm. The production is directed by EWP artistic director Tim Dang and promises to be the most emotionally powerful, dangerously provocative and beautifully poetic work you will see this year!



Playwright CHAY YEW's works include AS IF HE HEARS, PORCELAIN (London's Fringe Award for Best Play), A LANGUAGE OF THEIR

Award for Best Play), A LANGUAGE OF THEIR OWN (1995 George and Elisabeth Marton Playwriting Award & GLAAD s Best Play of 1995), HALF LIVES, ODE TO A WOMAN, FALLING and VOICES. His plays have been presented at the New York Shakespeare Festival, Royal Court Theatre (London), Palace Theatre (New York), Mark Taper Forum, Studio Theatre, Intiman Theatre, Woolly Mammoth Theatre, Actors Theatre in Louisville, Dallas Theatre Center and TheatreWorks (Singapore) His work is published by Performing Arts Journal, HarperCollins' Staging Gay Lives, Smith and Kraus' Best Scenes from Plays of 1995, and Best Monologues from Plays of 1995. A Storm is Blowing from Paradise and Central Park. His present projects include a commissioned play, FLAME OF THE FOREST, from the Public Theater, and a text-based dance entitled GOTHAM. A member of the Dramatists Guild, Mr. Yew is also a Resident Artist and the Director of the Asian Theatre Workshop at the Mark Taper Forum.

PORCELAIN focuses on a deadly crime of passion involving an Asian teenager and his white lover victim in a public toilet in East London. Interrogated by an in a public toilet in East Lohdon. Interrogated by an unscrupulous criminal psychologist, the boy unravels the world in which he lives: a world of homosexuality and homophobia, racism and isolation, washroom sex (called "cottaging" in Britain) and murder.

A LANGUAGE OF THEIR OWN is a play about love, A LANGUAGE OF THEIR OWN is a play about love, loss and language. It explores the interlocking relationships of four young men revealing the awkward comic first steps toward love, the strain to achieve friendship, and the fear and ultimate rage of loss. It examines how lovers create a way of communicating—verbally, physically and emotionally—which is unique to their relationship. Their shared language, at first nuanced and textured, brings them together, then later, as it becomes more complex and coded, it breaks them apart.

PART III

HALF LIVES is a series of vivid snapshots of a contemporary Asian family in pursuit of the American dream, liberation and a place to call home.
